Fund Friends Meet Hopeful Ouimet Applicants



Throughout the Spring, the Ouimet Fund held interviews at supporting clubs across the state. These interviews allow those present to get to know the 185

new scholarship applicants, all of whom have a goal of becoming a Ouimet Scholar this upcoming September. These interviews would not be possible, however, without the support of volunteers who come from all over Massachusetts to interview these applicants.

INTERVIEW EXPERIENCE

Interviewing is a rewarding and enjoyable experience for all involved, as volunteers meet some of the amazing young people who work at our clubs and will receive the support. The contribution of time is incredibly valuable

for The Fund in the overall evaluation of each applicant. Applicant interviews last approximately 20 minutes each, and a typical volunteer will interview five to six students in a days' "session." Four to six interviewers are in the room at one time and following the conversation with the applicant, conduct independent scoring as part of the Ouimet "admissions" process.

MEETING FUTURE LEADERS

Mark Tansey, a Ouimet Alumnus ('97) and loyal donor, commented after one of the larger sessions at Golf House in Norton in April, "I can't believe how strong this class of applicants was today. I was also thanking them for their time. It was so encouraging knowing that these are our future leaders, and are already doing so much in the community."


Ouimet Honoree Jim Furyk, Ryder Cup Highlight 2018 Banquet

This year's Ryder Cup Captain Jim Furyk was the guest speaker and honored with the 21st Francis Ouimet Award for Lifelong Contributions to Golf at the Francis Ouimet Scholarship Fund's 67th Annual Banquet. The Banquet, which has become the largest annual golf dinner in America, was held on Tuesday, March 27th at the Boston Convention & Exhibition Center.

A MODEL PLAYER & CAPTAIN

"We were thrilled to have Jim Furyk as our 2018 Honoree. He has a tremendous record, and has been one of the top players on the PGA TOUR for the past 24 years," said Jim Blue, Ouimet Fund President. "He's played on nine Ryder Cup teams, including here in Boston in 1999, and is greatly respected for his charitable work. We are all looking forward to him leading the U.S. Team in at the Ryder Cup Matches in Paris." Not only was the 2018 Ryder Cup Captain in attendance, but the historic Ryder Cup trophy was also on display for all guests to enjoy and take pictures next to.



This year's Banquet drew nearly 1,200 guests to the Convention Center and, as always, is a central event in the Ouimet Fund's ability to award more scholarship money every year. The Fund announced it plans to increase annual scholarships again beyond this year's record \$2 Million. Through the 2017-2018 academic year, The Fund has awarded nearly \$34 Million to 5,700 Scholars.

Ouimet Scholar Aodhan Doyle Achieves Dream at 2018 Olympics

While most college juniors are in the middle of studying for midterm exams, Ouimet Scholar Aodhan Doyle (Syracuse University '19, The Captains Golf Course) spent February as an intern for NBC at the Jeongseon Alpine Center in South Korea. It was a dream internship, but one that was extremely difficult to get. There were seven available spots in the internship program, and over 500 students applied.

GIVING CREDIT TO OUIMET INTERVIEW

The interview process was somewhat rigorous, and it took months to hear back from NBC. Aodhan felt the interview went well, and he gave a great deal of credit for his preparation to the Ouimet Fund scholarship interview process. "There's no doubt that going through the Ouimet interview

process helped prepare me for that," Aodhan mentioned, when speaking of his interview with NBC. "it gave me experience answering questions on the fly, and confidence that I didn't have to be
